

# Proceedings of Regular Board Meeting

April 11, 2017

The meeting was called to order by Village President, Mark Bade, at 6:00 PM. Present were Trustees; Ziebell, Suzda, and Hartjes. Absent; Trustee Dorshorst. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Trustee Ziebell moved that the minutes of the preceding meeting be approved as typed and distributed. Suzda seconded. Motion carried

Nothing has been heard from the County in regard to the damage done to the sewer line serving Paula Peters' residence. President Bade will again contact them.

Trustee Hartjes stated that he is still in the process of getting quotes to repair the welcome to Rudolph signs. We will see about getting funds from the Rudolph Community Fund to help pay for the repairs.

Bob Bradach of the Bradach Co. came before the Board to have his license to stock and sell fireworks in the Village renewed. It was noted that the Village has not received a single complaint in all the years he has been operating his business. Bade moved and Ziebell seconded that his license be renewed. Motion carried.

Bob Bradach said that he will be having a fireworks show at the park on July 1<sup>st</sup>, which is a Saturday with the rain date being Sunday July 2<sup>nd</sup>. He added that he would like to have a band playing at the concession stand and asked if there would be a charge for electricity, etc. Bade moved that because he puts on the fireworks show at no cost to the Village there be no charge for the space and electric use.

Possible street work for the up-coming County 50-50 Highway Program was discussed This will have to be finalized in the next month or so.

The Board of Review has been set for Wednesday, May 24<sup>th</sup> with the open book being held from 3 to 5 PM and the BOR from 5 to 7 PM.

Village employee Larry Hartjes reported that the deer carving outside of the hall is beginning to rot and appears to be irreparable. Also, the sign at the industrial park advertising land for sale needs to be repainted.

The road down to the sewer ponds and compost site is in need of about three loads of road base.

The listed bills were read and approved for payment.

This being the last meeting for President Bade and Treasurer Laska due to them not seeking re-election the Board presented them with plaques to express thanks for their many years of service to the Village. The new officers elected at the spring election were sworn in and took the oath of their office

On motion and vote the meeting was adjourned.
